While not widely known, the centre plays a vital role in rescuing and rehabilitating injured raptors, releasing those that can return to the wild. The Alberta Birds of Prey Centre offers interactive experiences with raptors like eagles, hawks, and owls. Visitors can enjoy daily flying demonstrations and even participate in hands-on activities such

as feeding or holding birds.
