## **Turner Valley Gas Plant**

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Located in the heart of Diamond Valley, the Turner Valley Gas Plant is the heart of Canada's first major oilfield. After oil was discovered in the area in 1914, a complex facility, incorporating some of the world's most innovative refining and processing technologies of the time. Despite suffering from a major fire in 1920 and a subsequent change in ownership, the Turner Valley Gas Plant continued to operate until 1985. With help from the Alberta Government and the Turner Valley Oilfield Society, the derelict facilities were converted into a museum.




### At a Glance

- Open during the summer from 10 AM to 5 PM on weekends
- Located off Highway 22 along Sunset Blvd
- Admissions are \$12 for adults, \$10 for seniors and \$6 for youth
- Closed-toe shoes are required for the tour of the facility

## **PIECE OF HISTORY**

Turner Valley Gas Plant is a meticulously preserved and well-maintained museum, a glimpse back in time for all visitors. Knowledgable and friendly staff offer guided tours of the gas plant and its facilities, ranging from distillation towers and desulfurisation equipment, to vast storage tanks. Walking through the museum and listening to the history gives visitors an appreciation of the remarkable ingenuity and grit that constructed Alberta's modern oil and gas industry





Open weekends between late May and early September, admissions give visitors access to a guided tour of the site. A guided tour will provide visitors a chance to get a close-up look at the equipment and techniques used in processing and refining the oil from Alberta's first major oil fields; the tour allows people to even enter the processing plants.









# WHERE

This historical site is located on Sunset Boulevard, a two-minute drive from the intersection at the heart of Turner Valley: the drive to the town of Diamond Valley is only fifty minutes from downtown Calgary, making it perfect as a destination for a quiet summer day trip.
